Implementation Plan vs. RFA

Implementation Plan

- Long-term Statewide SBCT Plan
 (3-5 years)
- To outline necessary elements for long-term, statewide expansion and sustainability
- No funding attached
- Due July 31

ITCP RFA State Expansion Grant

- Short-term Statewide SBCT Plan (1 year)
- Select 3 communities to implement the SBCT approach
- Creates a State Team
- Federal HRSA funding \$425,000
- Due July 24

Design Team Overview: Our Charge


- Core Components of SBCT
 - Maintain alignment and continually evaluate outcomes
- Sustainability
 - Financial sustainability & leveraging resources and services
- Variety of Communities
 - Inclusive of communities that are under resourced, politically diverse, geographically varied
- Explicit Race and Equity Lens
 - Meeting the needs of all families, equitably

Workgroup Updates

State Team Workgroup

- Final draft of State Plan Map
 - Illustrates flow of interaction between the teams
- Final stages of completing State Level Logic Model
- Begin identifying members of State Advisory Board
 - We will look to Design Team members to possibly join the State Advisory Board, or recommend individuals

Local Implementation Workgroup

- Developed Site Selection process
 - Based on:
 - Community need
 - Our Charge + Criteria List developed by workgroup
 - Site Outreach has begun
- Final stages of Completing Local Logic Model
- Begin identifying members for Active Community Team (ACT)

Local Implementation Workgroup - Site Selection Process

- Community Need
 - O Utilized Dependency court data on highest cases of 0-3 served
 - Focus on racial disproportionality
 - Communities considered high-risk (mapped by DCYF)
- Criteria list Culled from "our charge" and member input
 - Includes judicial leadership and community buy-in; communities with largest numbers of kids 0-3 served; geographic diversity

Local Implementation Workgroup

- Initial list of communities identified by workgroup:
 - Yakima
 - Snohomish
 - Spokane
 - Kitsap
 - Clark
 - Thurston



Next Step: Outreach communities to gauge judicial and DCYF interest

Legislative Workgroup

- Brief Legislative Updates
 - Possibility to create legislative foundation for 2021 and beyond
- Review of Florida SBCT Legislation (CS/CS/HB 1105)
 - Provides framework the SBCT approach
 - Standardizes judicial education on parent-child attachment, placement stability, and impact of trauma on child development

Messaging Workgroup

• Created WA State Mission, Vision, and Values Statements

 Statements to reflect centering parents, racial equity, relationships, collaboration, systems change

• Members participated in multiple rounds of feedback

Messaging Workgroup

- <u>Mission Statement:</u> To promote lasting, positive outcomes for parents, infants, and toddlers in the child welfare system by transforming the court process to be parent-centered, relationship-based, racially and culturally equitable, and collaborative.
- <u>Vision Statement:</u> Parents, infants, and toddlers are safe, healthy and thriving in communities where equity, relationships, and collaboration are celebrated.
- <u>Values:</u> Collaboration, Community, Empowerment, Hope, Relationship,
 Integrity

Funding Workgroup

- Did not delve into broader funding plan as RFA provided opportunity for immediate funding
 - Expected that State Team Workgroup will address issues of future funding
- ZERO TO THREE can provide supports and technical assistance for long term planning to look at a variety of funding options
 - Fund Mapping
 - Sustainability Plan

Data and Evaluation Workgroup

- Reviewed ZERO TO THREE's data elements
 - Data collection and reporting is a good option for evaluation
 SBCT program implementation and outcomes in Washington
 - Data options can be revisited in a few years to determine if our needs have changed
- Recommended to create a statewide data advisory group
- Education and support provided to local sites
