2. An umbrella term that describes a person whose gender identity differs from the biological sex assigned to them at birth.		Sexual Orientation Gender Identity Gender Expression Biological Sex
3. Describes a person who identifies as gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, gender neutral, questioning, and/or many other identities. While this term has been used in a derogatory way in the past, many individuals and groups are reclaiming it as an all-encompassing way to describe those who do not identify as heterosexual and/or cisgender. 4. The potential to be attracted-- romantically and/or sexually-- to people of more than one sex and/or gender, not necessarily at the same time, not necessarily in the same way, and not necessarily to the same degree.		Sexual Orientation Gender Identity Gender Expression Biological Sex
5. An umbrella term for differences in sex traits or reproductive anatomy. Describes people who are born with these differences or develop them in childhood. There are many possible differences in genitalia, hormones, internal anatomy, or chromosomes, compared to the usual two ways that human bodies develop. <p>9. An umbrella term that describes a person who identifies as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and/or queer/questioning. <p>12. An identity term for romantic and/or sexual attraction to people regardless of gender identity or to people of all genders. For some, gender is not a defining characteristic of the attraction they feel to others.
