We are thrilled to announce the appointment of **Rachel Sottile Logvin as the new President/CEO of CCYJ** 12 years after we launched this effort to create better lives through better systems. Rachel's appointment will take effect on December 5, 2018.

The Board of Directors engaged in an extensive national search to identify for our second President and CEO an innovative visionary, experienced executive, and passionate advocate for justice for children and youth to lead CCYJ into the next phase of our groundbreaking and necessary work.

Rachel comes to CCYJ with more than twenty years of executive leadership experience in the non-profit sector and state government. She is a champion of systems reform, with professional experience in foster care and other challenges that impact children and youth. In the last ten years, Rachel's work centered on advocacy, education, and systems reform, most recently as Senior Vice President of the Pretrial Justice Institute (PJI) in Rockville, Maryland, advocating for safe, fair, and effective juvenile and adult pretrial practices. Prior to PJI Rachel served as Executive Director of the YES Institute in Miami, Florida working on preventing suicide through communication and education on gender and orientation. At YES Institute Rachel doubled revenues and expanded educational growth by 96% including expanding reach by offering curriculum in English, Spanish, Haitian-Creole, and American Sign Language.



Rachel brings to CCYJ a long record of effective executive leadership in systems reform, strategic planning and implementation, donor relations, and financial oversight. Of the position of President/CEO, she says,

"I am honored to serve as CCYJ's next President & CEO, building upon the last 12 years of impactful results led by Justice Bridge and a deeply committed Staff and Board of Directors. This foundation will provide us the opportunity to amplify and expand our work in bold, innovative ways. I will continue the relentless pursuit of outcomes for children and youth of Washington State, advancing justice and creating a new future for children & youth individually, and collectively as a community, where children learn, grow, and thrive, and receive every possible opportunity to succeed in fulfilling their dreams."

Rachel grew up in Seattle and is happy to be returning to the Northwest. She earned her Bachelor of Arts degree from Emory University and a Master's degree in Counseling Psychology from Georgia State University.
